## City of Gold Coast filming rules

1. The person operating the film production must ensure that—
  - (a) no printed literature, poster, handbill or similar item is permitted to be distributed, displayed or affixed on or over any road, pole or fence as part of the operation of the film production; and
  - (b) no permanent or temporary structure is erected as part of the operation of the film production; and
  - (c) the film production is not operated for more than 2 hours at any 1 location; and
  - (d) all cabling and power leads used in the operation of the film production are—
    - (i) placed in a way that ensures public safety is maintained at all times; and
    - (ii) covered so as not to cause a trip hazard; and
  - (e) the time of operation of the film production does not detrimentally affect the amenity of neighbouring premises; and
  - (f) the operation of the film production does not cause a noise nuisance to neighbouring premises; and
  - (g) lighting associated with the operation of the film production is angled or shaded in such a manner that the light does not cause a nuisance to any nearby premises or on any road; and
  - (h) the operation of the film production does not incorporate special effects which involve the use or release of particulate matter or any visible contaminant, for example, dust, smoke, fumes or aerosols which are likely to cause environmental nuisance; and
  - (i) the operation of the film production does not involve the lighting of any fire; and
  - (j) if the film production is undertaken in a park or reserve—no fencing, trees or shrubs are interfered with or damaged; and
  - (k) the operation of the film production does not include photography in an amenity building of the local government, for example, a toilet block, shower block or change room; and
  - (l) any premises, building, structure, vehicle, facility or equipment used in the operation of the film production is left in a clean and tidy condition with all litter collected and removed during, and at the end of, the operation of the film production; and
  - (m) the operation of the film production does not, at any time, unduly disturb or disrupt the use of any public place; and
  - (n) if an authorised person gives the person undertaking the operation of the film production a direction about the use of a public place—the person operating the film production complies with the direction; and

- (o) the person is the holder of a current registration from the Gold Coast Media Centre.
2. The operation of the film production must not—
    - (a) create a traffic problem or hazard; or
    - (b) increase an existing traffic problem or hazard; or
    - (c) impede pedestrian or vehicular traffic; or
    - (d) block or partially block a path or road; or
    - (e) detrimentally affect the efficiency of the existing road network; or
    - (f) create a threat to public safety; or
    - (g) damage, or have potential to damage, public infrastructure.
  3. The operation of the film production must not be carried out within 20m of a bathing area in a bathing reserve unless authorised by an on-duty lifeguard for the bathing area.
  4. The person operating the film production must not operate a drone or a model aircraft propelled by a motor unless authorised by the local government.
  5. The person operating the film production must not drive, or permit to be driven, a vehicle on a bathing reserve, park or reserve unless authorised by the local government.
  6. The person operating the film production must not enter, or remain in, a conservation area (*list to be supplied*) unless authorised by the local government.
  7. The person operating the film production must not use a State-controlled road for the regulated activity without the written permission of the Department of Main Roads.
  8. The person operating the film production must not use the light rail corridor for the regulated activity without the written permission of the operator of the light rail system.
  9. The person operating the film production must, at all times, hold a current broadform public liability insurance policy for not less than \$10,000,000.00 which names the local government as an insured party and which is otherwise on those terms and conditions as regulated by the local government from time to time.
